We have recently acquired an etching entitled 'Eagle's Wharf' by James McNeill Whistler.
Dated 1859, the etching shows collier ships unloading, with coal heavers moving coal from the large ships into lighter boats below.
The etching has been conserved and we hope to display it soon.






