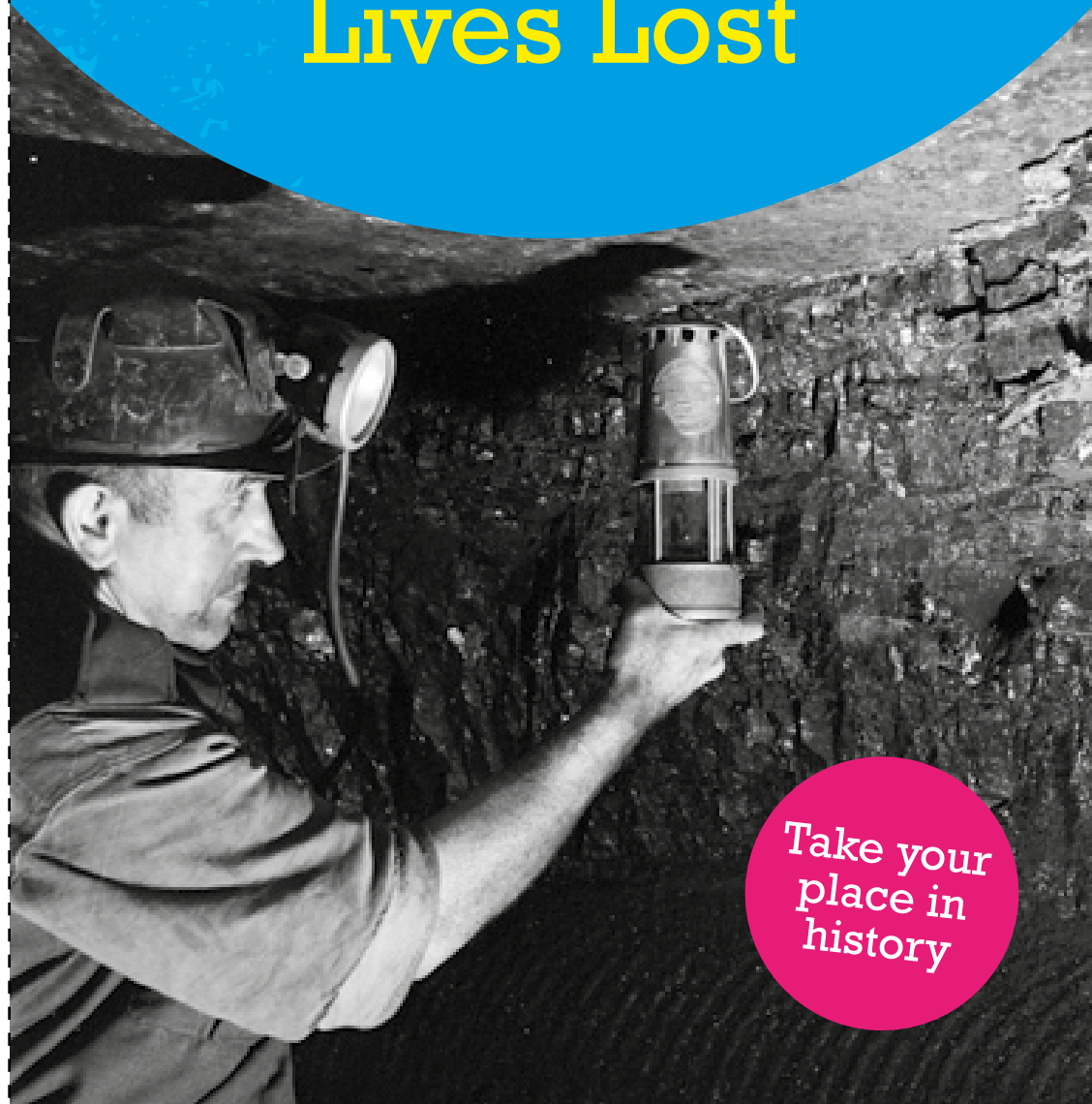

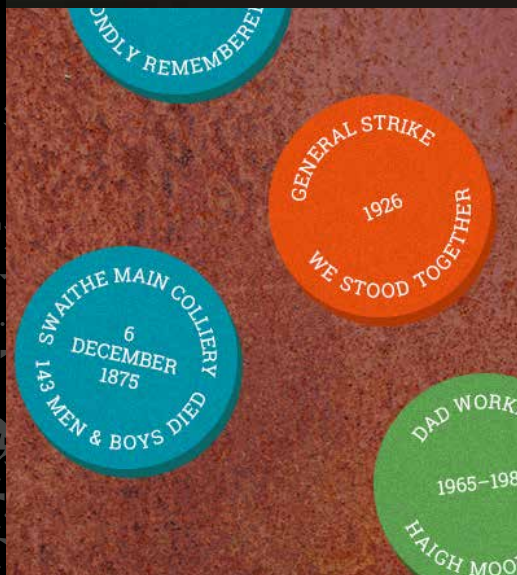
Take your place in history...

Our Miners' Memorial Garden celebrates and commemorates the courage and camaraderie of miners, and the close-knit families and communities that supported them.

A place for quiet contemplation and reflection, the Garden allows all who visit us to share memories of what coal mining has meant to them over many generations.

At the heart of the Garden stands a unique **'Lives Lived, Lives Lost'** artwork. Designed by popular public artist Stephen Broadbent, the sculpture stands almost 3 metres high, curving around in a sweeping arc. The sculpture will hold your coal mining memories in the form of colourful glass checks.

It has never been more important to remember the unsung heroes who helped to make Britain great. The miners' courage and camaraderie, and their families and communities that surrounded them, deserve to be celebrated and commemorated, and **you can make this possible** by donating a glass check to our living artwork.



Each glass check is individually handcrafted in a variety of vibrant colours by glass artists Gary and Annette McMillan. Layers of glass are brought together and kiln-formed, fusing your selected personalised text on to the check and creating a unique and lasting memory for years to come.

Your donation of £40 will not only be an act of remembrance. You will also be supporting the continuing maintenance of the Miners' Memorial Garden and the further development of the **'Lives Lived, Lives Lost'** sculpture that sits at its heart.
